Really Groovy Dinner Interrupted By Murder. Downer, Man... by Michal Jacot

The Tawas Bay Players and the Knights of Columbus once again joined forces for our second annual Murder Mystery Dinner Theatre on February 22 and 23. The show, "Lost in the 60's", was directed by Michal Jacot and produced by Sue Duncan, the same team who did last year's show. This year we did one of Michal's original shows. The cast loves the "Michal Jacot Method"; they are given a character bio consisting of one sheet of information. No rehearsals, no lines to memorize, and they improvise everything throughout the evening. They don't even know who the murderer is until



it's revealed to the audience (well, the actual murderer knows, of course, but he/she is sworn to secrecy). The end result is involvement in a show that's low on time commitment and high on adrenalin as the actors literally make it up as they go along. And since you have no idea what the audience is going to ask you, it's like walking a theatrical tightrope.

Before the action began, we had a wonderful dinner courtesy of the Knights of Columbus, who really know how to feed people. Our guests enjoyed the show, and were zealously grilling the cast for clues even before anything started. I was astounded how many guests dressed for the part. You always get a table or two of rowdy partiers who want to join in the fun by dressing for whatever the theme calls for. But there must be something about the Decade of Love that brought out the fashion nostalgia in people. I haven't seen that many bell bottoms, tie-dyed shirts, peace signs and long hair on people since ... well, it's been a few decades.

But if the guests were decked out nicely, our cast was absolutely far-out, totally rocking their psychedelic colors, fringed vests and John Lennon glasses. Alan Dalton played musical icon Charlie Trask to the hilt – I swear I remember buying some of this guy's albums. So it was a real bummer when he strummed his electric guitar and got a fatal shock that left him ob-la-di, ob-la-dead. After that, the investigation was taken over by Detective Scott Reasoner (Michal Jacot), who is something of an inside joke among murder mystery devotees. He's the recurring character Michal uses in all of his murder mysteries. He's like the old lady in Murder She Wrote – everywhere he shows up, somebody gets murdered.

Reasoner, in his police-issue trenchcoat and stylish "Nixon's The One!" lapel button, questioned the unsavory hippie element wandering about ...There were Smash Calahan (Ray Skiver), a dangerous radical with a penchant for explosives, Trixie Robinson (Deb DeBois), the career-driven female singer in Charlie's band who wanted him gone, Sunshine Moon and Stars Flower Meadow Schwartz (Beth Borowski), the spacy hippie girl with ties to Charlie, Cindi Seeley (Katie Hill) a groupie following Charlie's band, but with an ulterior motive and Mellow Imperial (Michael Denney), a fellow musician who apparently had smoked one too many of those funny cigarettes before arriving. Also in the mix were Benny Culpepper (newcomer Wade Sydenstricker), Charlie's sleazy agent, ready to make a buck from the celebrity death, Elmer Hatfield (Keith Frank), the farmer who owned the land Charlie's Woodstock-style concert was set to perform on and Rita Renaldo (Tina Dalton), a hotshot lawyer from Washington on a mission to save America from the corrupt hippie movement.

The show is written with two different endings, so we had a different murderer each night (to avoid anyone watching the show on Friday and spilling the beans to anyone coming on Saturday). The cast played their parts over-the-top, and you could tell they were all having an enormous amount of fun with it. We all had a great time with it. Sue's "Dream Team" of helpers kept the technical side of things going with precision. Even when things didn't go as planned (and when you're improvising all night, you kind of expect glitches), we just went with it. One of those spontaneous moments included pulling a "non-existent in the 60's" cell phone from Katie's handbag and having to explain it, and giving the finger to Mellow Imperial (long story, but hey, it worked). Bottom line, everyone had fun, cast, the crew, and our guests. Many thanks to everyone who participated!

Dress Rehearsal Policy by Keith Frank

For the past several months, the Board has struggled with the issue of dress rehearsal attendance. It had always been the policy that TBP members were allowed to attend dress rehearsals. In addition to TBP members, residents of Tawas Village and local nursing homes were also invited to attend. However, for the past several years, people were showing up who were not TBP members. After several attempts at establishing a policy to regulate dress rehearsal attendance, the Board passed the following official dress rehearsal policy at their December 22, 2015 meeting:

Full dress rehearsal is usually the final rehearsal of the production and takes place one or two days before opening night. Tawas Bay Players allow an invited audience to dress rehearsal to prepare the cast and crew for audience reactions. Because an audience is present, royalties are paid for dress rehearsals.

Dress rehearsals are not open or advertised to the general public. It is an in-house performance and, strictly speaking, is still a rehearsal. The following people are allowed to watch dress rehearsals at no charge:

- Anyone who works on the production in a capacity notable enough to be listed in the program as technical crew. (For crew members with jobs integral to the running of the production, someone needs to fill in for them.)
- All current, paid members of Tawas Bay Players, whether they have worked on the show or not.
- Invited guests as approved by the Board including (but not limited to) residents from the local assisted living and medical care facilities (i.e., Tendercare, Iosco Medical Care Facility, Lakeview Manor), Bay Park Towers, students from area schools, etc.
- Additionally, six (6) seats for each production's dress rehearsal will be made available to the show's producer to be used if and as needed. The producer must provide a list of those using these seats to the Box Office Manager prior to each dress rehearsal.

Also regarding dress rehearsal, the Tawas Bay Players Board is happy to announce an opportunity to area youth. An invitation to high school teachers of drama, English, American history and Government has been extended for students and at least one adult chaperone from each area school to attend the dress rehearsal of *Twelve Angry Jurors*. It is hoped that this might enrich students understanding and experience of the arts as well as our judicial system. And perhaps it will spark a new interest or hobby to explore in theatre. So, expect to see some unfamiliar faces at dress rehearsals. Please welcome and help make them comfortable, perhaps by starting a conversation as you await the beginning of the performance.

Community Theater in The Community or How We Brought A CTAM Conference to East Tawas by Donna Thomas

For the first time ever in our 35 plus year history, Tawas Bay Players is hosting a CTAM conference! Twice a year CTAM has conferences to forward ideas and information for the community theaters of Michigan. For the spring 2016 conference, CTAM approached TBP to host after the original location chosen could not host. This event will bring in 50-100 people who previously have not been to our area. While the thought was we would have "short notice" to put something together, Co-Chairs, Sue Duncan and I have been able to put forward a very nice variety of events and workshops, showcasing our community. A few times it even felt like a "Mickey and Judy – Let's put on a show!" atmosphere. Several TBP members, local organizations and businesses have stepped up offering to help showcase our beautiful community. Others have offered to help with refreshments and any other items we may need. We also welcome any ideas or help TBP members wish to offer.

The cost to attend is \$60. For the arriving attendees Friday night, we will be having an early registration with snacks and beverages at Witz End Studio. We will also have TBP members hosting our "Dine Around" where attendees can sign up to go with a group to one of our local restaurants (maximum of 15 people each). Some attendees may choose to see our TBP production of *The Marvelous Wonderettes*. Sue has also arranged a super cool idea, Masquerade Mask Making at Twisted Twinz Emporium in Tawas City. This will be an extra cost to cover materials but looks to be a rather neat venture. Other workshop subjects include Set Design, Make Up, Auditioning, Comedic Acting, Publicity, and Enunciation/Vocalization to name a few. Saturday starts out with registration check in at 8 a.m. and workshops begin at 9 a.m. at the Beach Resort. Between 9 and 12:30 we will have 6 workshops then break for lunch. Most will be in the Newman Street area so as they walk, the attendees will be able to shop and check us out! Saturday night, a buffet style dinner will be hosted by the Knights of Columbus Hall, then it is off to see the TBP production of *The Marvelous Wonderettes*. Afterwards we will be hanging out at Topsiders at the Beach Resort for networking and more entertaining.

On Sunday morning attendees can get up late and shop around town as nothing is scheduled other than enjoying the Bay. They may also choose to see the matinee show of *The Marvelous Wonderettes*, and the CTAM board will be holding a meeting once again at Witz End Studio. Currently workshop venues on Saturday will be the Playhouse, Brew Krew, Witz End Studio and The Art Gallery. Please check out the TBP website for a complete list of events and times, and any updated/changed information. Community Theater Association of Michigan is an organization of many community theaters including TBP. Many of our members are also individual members of CTAM. We look forward to this opportunity with great excitement to showcase our city and theater members.
