Annual Meeting Highlights by Keith Frank

If you missed our annual meeting and picnic, you missed a good time. More than 50 members attended the event at Durant Park on August 9 and enjoyed playing croquet, "corn hole", ladder ball, and an assortment of board games. For those of you who were not able to attend, here are some highlights from the "meeting" portion of the event:

Murder Mystery – TBP and the Knights of Columbus will be hosting a second, "60's" themed Murder Mystery on January 22 and 23, 2016.

New Dress Rehearsal Policy – Beginning with our 2015 fall production of *Nunsensations*, members who attend dress rehearsal will be required to show their TBP membership card in order to attend. See the next article for more details.

Play Reading – The Board has reinstated the Play Reading committee. Michal Jacot will be heading it up. The committee will submit plays in addition to the plays recommended by the Artistic Advisory Committee. It is the feeling of the Board that the more plays they have to choose from, the better.

CTAM Regional Workshop – The Artistic Advisory Committee, along with Sue Duncan and others, is planning a second regional workshop supported by CTAM and TBP focusing on acting education. The workshop will be held at the theater on Saturday, November 5, 2015.

A Dozen Legends – Tawas Bay Players in conjunction with Dennis Szatkowski will be hosting *A Dozen Legends*, a musical tribute, scheduled for October 30, 31 and November 1, 2015. The show is a musical review of the #1 hits of many of the greatest country and pop entertainers. This is not a regular part of our program so tickets will be sold separately. Proceeds from the show will go to the Players. (See separate article for details)

2016 Annual Meeting – The 2016 Annual Meeting will be a catered dinner meeting at the K of C Hall on Friday, August 12, 2016. Time and menu are yet to be determined. After a number of years of picnic meetings, several members have asked that we go back to a dinner venue. We talked to the K of C and they were happy to accommodate us. Cost will be determined and announced at later date.

As a benefit of membership, paid members are allowed to attend dress rehearsals of TBP productions for free. However, over the past several years there have been people in attendance at dress rehearsal who are not members of Tawas Bay Players (this does not include our guests from Tawas Village, Medicare or Lakeview Manor). Since there are really not that many actual “benefits” of membership, several members have brought this to the Board’s attention, wondering why they should pay their memberships. As a result, the Board came up with the following policy:

Beginning with our 2015 fall production of Nunsensations, members who wish to attend dress rehearsals will be required to show their TBP membership card in order to be admitted.

2015 Raffle Warp-Up by Deb DeBois

The 2015 Summer Raffle (our 16th) came to an end with the drawing of the winners on WKJC, Monday morning, September 28th. (See the winners posted below at the end of article.) We were lucky and made a profit of \$5,469 this year. The gross amount earned \$8,391, minus the expenses of \$2,922, gave us this NICE profit. With sales at the various events bringing in \$5,116 and Members selling \$3,275 we were a bit lower than last year's sales. Costs were down, but our sales at the events and by our members were lower, perhaps due to the fact that snow is not what people want to think about until the winter. We sold 2,368 tickets, with 199 lost and unsold out of the 4,040 printed.

Many a thank-you goes out to the members who sold all of their tickets and to those who sold part of their ticket package. Top sellers this year were: Bob/Nadeen O'Merra selling 62 tickets (Top sellers for the third year in a row.), Beth Borowski selling 42 and Keith Frank with 40. Congrats!

I would like to thank the people who helped me out all summer. The heart of country music still beats in so many of us and has been my inspiration to direct and produce *A Dozen Legends*, a musical tribute show highlighting the life and songs of over a dozen artists listed in the top 30 entertainers of all time. Every single song performed in this show was a #1 hit on the Billboard and Country charts. There will be comedy, professional musicians and singers who will pay tribute to artists such as: Patsy Cline, Merle Haggard, Elvis Presley, Willie Nelson, Tammy Wynette, Dolly Parton, Johnny Cash, Kenny Rogers, George Jones Roy Orbison and many more. Our own TBP funny man, Michal Jacot along with Stacy Perrot, will provide a country blend of humor as they pay tribute to Minnie Pearl and K.O.R.N radio announcer funny man, Charlie Farquharson.

TBP Hosts CTAM Regional Acting Workshop

Tawas Bay Players is once again hosting a CTAM regional workshop. On Saturday, November 7, CTAM members, interested thespians, and complete newbies are invited to solve the "Mysteries of Acting" during a six hour session. Leeds Bird from the Bay City Players will be our instructor/presenter. Leeds is a long-time friend of TBP and a veteran actor, director, and theatre teacher. Mr. Bird has led many workshops for CTAM conferences and taught directing at summer camp in 2013. Sessions will include: The scene of the crime: Auditions, Finding Clues to your Character in the Script, Finding Clues to Your Character in Yourself, Breathing Life into a Gasping Character, Giving and Taking with Actors on the Scene, Learning Elements of Disguise: Fitting in While Standing Out plus Rounding up the Usual Suspects for Activities and Questions.

The workshop will be held at the Playhouse with an 8:30 a.m. registration. The workshop will begin promptly at 9:00 a.m. and continue until 3:00 p.m. Pre-registration is \$25: after Friday, October 23, 2015 registration is \$30. Registration includes coffee, morning treats, lunch, water and the book TIPS: Ideas for Actors by Jon Jory (a \$17 value). Individual CTAM members will receive education accreditation hours. Murder? Far Out, Man! “Lost in the 60’s” Promises a Groovy Time for Everyone by Michal Jacot

Let’s go back in time. You are at a 1960’s rock festival. It’s held in an open field (sound familiar?) The headlining act is your favorite band, Charlie Trask and the Cordless Blueberries. Suddenly, lead singer Charlie is killed when he plugs in his electric guitar and is electrocuted. It is quickly discovered that the guitar was rigged to deliver a fatal shock. Someone is guilty of murdering Charlie. Bad scene, man.

That’s the setup for *Lost In The 60’s*, a murder mystery dinner TBP will present in conjunction with the Knights of Columbus. Last winter’s *Murder on Maui* went over so well we’re trying it again. The good people at K of C will provide the venue and the food, and we’ll provide the entertainment. We’ve still got a ways to go (middle of January) before the show goes on, but I thought I’d put the idea in your head. Think about when that Michigan winter hits and you’re looking for something fun to do. Helping out in a murder mystery is great fun! Too chicken to get up in front of people? So work behind the scenes. There will be fun opportunities for costuming and, in fact, creative spins you can put on just about any aspect of the backstage process. Sue Duncan is the go-to gal for the production part of this. Talk to her; she loves creative people.

Or are you one of those daring souls who wants to take on a highly improvisational evening of acting? (Trust me, it's not as hard as you think.) Then talk to me. *Lost in the 60's* is written by me. There are no lines to memorize, and rehearsals will be very sparse – no more than two nights of get-togethers. So if your excuse is “I can't memorize lines” or “I don't have time for rehearsals,” I gotcha! What kind of parts am I looking for? Well, check some of these characters out:

- Benny Culpepper – Charlie's agent. The slick promoter who put the concert together.
- Elmer Hatfield – the farmer who owns the land the concert is performed on.
- Rita Rinaldo – the hotshot lawyer who has been lobbying to shut down the concert.
- Smash Calahan – the radical, protesting the concert.
- Trixie Robinson – a member of the Cordless Blueberries band.
- Sunshine Moon and Stars Flower Meadow Schwartz – a spacy hippie girl.
- Cindi Seeley – a groupie tagging along with the concert.
- Mellow Imperial – another act appearing at the concert and now its star headliner.

Also appearing: Charlie Trask (the murder victim) and Scott Reasoner, the investigating detective who seems to show up any time, any decade, when a murder occurs (at least in the ones I write!) You'll hear more about the show as it gets closer. If you're interested in being involved in it, let me or Sue know. You're not committing to anything; you're just saying, “hey, if I'm available when you get started on this thing, and you need someone, call me.” I'm not promising you anything, nor are you promising anything to me. But just let me know of your interest now, and I'll see what we can do. It will be fun, I promise you. Will marijuana be involved? That part is up to you.

Grape Salad

- 4 pounds red seedless grapes washed and dried
- 1 softened block cream cheese
- 1 8oz container sour cream
- 1 tablespoon almond extract
- 2 tablespoons sugar if grapes are not sweet enough

Mix all but grapes than add grapes and chill.

Chocolate Trifle

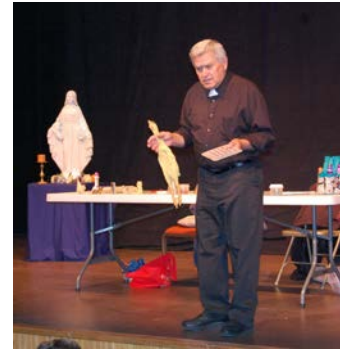
Bake one (1) family size package of brownie mix as directed on box and cool completely. Mix one (1) large package of instant chocolate pudding mix with 2 ½ cups of cold milk until slightly thickened. Fold in two (2) cups of whipped topping from a 24 oz. container. Crumble ½ of the brownies in the bottom of a large bowl. Spread ½ of the pudding mixture over the brownies and top the pudding with ½ of the remaining whipped topping. Sprinkle one (1) crushed Heath bar over topping. Repeat layers ending with another crushed Heath bar. Chill until time to serve.
