Imagine if you will, signing up to do a light-hearted comedy for something fun to do over the summer months. Then the adjudicator says "you should take this on the road, and by that I mean AACTFest!".

No, it wasn't the Twilight Zone (and for trivia fans, Rod Serling never actually said "Imagine if you will").

Leaving Iowa, last summer's hit comedy, did "take it on the road" to AACTFest in Bay City Feb. 27th- Mar 2nd. The American Association of Community Theater holds a competition every two years. This year's state level event was held at Bay City Players. Seven theater groups brought their best (or favorite) show – or at least a portion of it! The performance is limited to 1 hour (and timed), so groups not only had to rework their set design and

staging, they had to craft a version of their play that fit the time constraint and was approved by the publisher and/or the authors!

Not only is the performance itself timed, but the set must fit in a 10 foot by 10 foot space and be able to be set up within 10 minutes and struck in the same time limit! For *Leaving Iowa*, virtually every part of the set had to be adjusted in some way to either fit the hosting theater, or meet the strict timing requirements.



The adjudication is timed as well, with each of the 3 judges getting 5 minutes. Having 3 (sometimes) different perspectives is an additional learning experience, though I much prefer the regular show adjudication in our own space, where it can be a true dialog between the reviewer and the cast and crew.

Competition can drive you to up your game – if it doesn't get in your way of having fun and learning. Fortunately, this group that has been working towards the festival since July 2024 came together as

a family, and made entertaining the audience our number one goal. We met that goal easily – the audience began its applause as we set up our somewhat whimsical and complicated set, and that audience laughed every minute of the performance. Having other theater groups appreciate your work is quite uplifting!

Talking about being together for a while, this group has been together since May 7, 2024 when we had auditions! Not only did we rehearse several

times a week, but with **Sheila Krebs'** leadership, we rented two big VRBO houses and lived together for the 4 days! Sheila and **Janie Mundy** also took care of meal planning – so we broke bread together. The living room of the bigger house provided just enough room for team meetings and one final rehearsal on Friday during our "free time." Can you imagine working on a show for ten months and then living together?!

There were some challenges, for sure – including a last minute, undocumented rule change on performance day. Stage manager **Adam Davis** handled it professionally, and I might add with a greater calm than I might

have mustered. There were other unacceptable challenges as well, yet we managed to rise above each and every one and perform magnificently.

Speaking of great performances, both our teen cast members **Lily Toth** and **Malcolm Davis** each won an "Outstanding Achievement in Cameo Role" award. I am so proud of the work that each and every cast and crew member did, and I know everyone will cherish the experience in may ways.

Our "Iowa Family" will always be family in my book! Now, on to *Squirrel Lake!* 

I would like to thank the TBP for sponsoring the cast and crew of *Leaving Iowa* to go to AACTFest. Seventeen of us had a wonderful time! It was a lot of work. You just don't know how much **Ed and Sheila** 

**Krebs** put into this project. They had to take a two-hour show and cut it down to one hour, get it approved, then shrink the set to fit a ten-by-ten foot square. The whole set had to be refigured. The cast had to relearn blocking and adjust cue lines for the play. That alone was mind blowing.

Competition was amazing. We saw seven shows in two days, and all seven theaters brought their best. We didn't make it to the next level but it's okay because our young actors took the stage to receive awards. **Malcolm Davis** and **Lily Toth** received Outstanding Achievement in Cameo Roles; they stole the show!

The fellowship we experienced over the weekend was so much fun. Sitting around the table eating and talking; it went on and on. Thank you, Sheila for finding us two beautiful AirBnB's, and for all your hard work pulling us all together.

I have to say Bay City Players did an awesome job with the after parties. Pizza, hot dogs, walking tacos, sandwiches, drinks, and ice cream. And karaoke! We had so much fun singing, networking, talking to all the other



groups. I watched Suzan invite speakers for her fall workshop with ACTM in Midland. I watched our teens exchange numbers and make new friends.

All in all it was the best weekend I've had in a long time. Last note: thank you to all the TBP friends and family members who came down to support us and watch the shows.
